



Revere to Newhall Trails

Finding the Trailheads: there are four ways into these 9+ acres of woodlands, each marked by "Parkwood Pathways" signs:

Trailhead 1, between 5304 and 5306 Revere: the entrance is a little non-obvious —go straight back from the 'Pathways' sign, staying just to the left of the driveway, and you'll see an arrow sign behind the house, with the trail straight ahead back through the woods. It's a well-established path through large older trees; watch for deer sign, nest-building birds, and a footbridge over the intermittent small stream.

Trailhead 2, between 5324 and 5328 Revere, is easy to see, and leads back to a large open area, sometimes used for neighborhood soccer practice. When you come to the "T" area shown on the map (it's all a big open grassy area), you can turn to the right, go past the 'Pathways' sign, and circle through the woods back to Trailhead 1. Turning to the left takes you past another 'Pathways' sign to meet the trail between Trailheads 3 and 4.

Trailhead 3 is a narrower, grassy pathway going back some 800 feet, across a small footbridge, and into another open area. Keep going straight ahead (the trail is a little narrow in places), and you'll come out on Newhall Rd. at Trailhead 4, with a very nice grassy area straight ahead for viewing the lake.

Revere Rd. has a sidewalk opposite all the Trailheads there; if you walk along Newhall, there's no sidewalk, but it's generally a quiet stroll.

Distances: looping through the woods from 1 to 3 is about 2,700 ft., then 1,400 ft. back up Revere – so about a 3/4-mile walk. Starting from 4, across to 3, is about 1,400 ft. If you're more ambitious and start at 1, go through woods and open spaces to Trailhead 4 on Newhall, then up Newhall, across Clermont and back to the starting point, it's a walk of about 1 1/4 miles. The southern route – from Trailhead 3 down to Sedwick, west to Newhall and back up to Trailhead 4 – is about 2,200 ft.
