## Monthly Food Drives Begin: Parkwood for Parktown Food Hub!

We are starting a monthly food drive for Parktown Food Hub, the food pantry located right here in Parkwood. At last year's flea market, movie night, and fall fest, attendees generously donated food and funds for the Food Hub. We'd like to expand on that success. Our first food drive will be **Friday-Sunday, April 24-26**, at three locations around Parkwood: **5301 Pelham Road, 5317 Newhall Road, and 1607 Euclid Road**. Collection bins will be out to accept your donations. Watch for the signs! Bins will also be available in the HOA building, both the office (open Wednesdays 2:30-5:00 pm) and the community center side.

Beginning **June 5-7**, we will have food drives **every month** on the first weekend of the month.

What to donate? New, unopened, unexpired shelf-stable items (no glass containers please), such as:

- Canned tuna, chicken, beef stew
- Canned beans, vegetables, tomato sauce
- Canned soups and broths
- Mac & cheese
- Dry beans
- Pasta, ramen, rice
- Oatmeal, cereal, cereal bars
- Peanut butter, jelly

Thank you to the Parkwood Events Committee for helping get these food drives going. And special thanks to our neighbors who have kindly offered to host the collections at their homes, two of which also host Little Free Libraries!

## Bulky Item Pickup

Residents can submit a request online at [www.durhamnc.gov/durham-one-call](http://www.durhamnc.gov/durham-one-call) or call Durham One Call at 919-560-1200.

Generally, 3 items can be picked up for Free.

When disposing of appliances, all food and debris must be removed prior to collection. Remove or secure doors to eliminate potential hazards to children. When disposing of lawn equipment, gasoline, oil and any other fluids must be removed before collection.

### Prohibited Items

There are items that are excluded from Bulky Item curbside service. These items should be disposed of at the City's Waste Disposal and Recycling Center, located at 2115 East Club Boulevard.

## Update on Changes to Parkwood Press Newsletter Delivery

In December and January we announced that the opt-in delivery copies of Parkwood Press would no longer be delivered. We decided to step back a bit and reassess the need for opt-in delivery.

This issue, April 2026 is being delivered to the approximately 130 opt-in homes as a paper booklet, while other Parkwood households will access the newsletter digitally via the link shared via email and social media. Every household in Parkwood will be delivered the July 2026 issue and subsequent January and July issues.

1. The next EC meeting will be 1 Apr at 7:00 pm
2. Office internet. AT&T installation is scheduled for 18 Mar,
3. Reviewed community issues and complaints. People continue to park on our parklands. Suggest NO PARKING, TOWING ENFORCED signs be looked into by PPC.
4. HOA Point of Contact. Laura is the point for assuring that we can get proof of insurance and W-9 before hiring vendors. She is also the single point of contact for requesting payment from PPM and all outside communications involving Parkwood HOA. We will ask Laura to see that references to Parkwood are removed from PPM's website.
5. PPM request to be put on the First Citizen account again. We do not need PPM to pursue the quotes for an audit at this time.
6. Durham development zone changes. We will follow up with our attorney for clarification as to whether the Land Development Code (LDC) will override our covenants.
7. Keys to the Office/Community Center. There is no current way to determine how many keys to our facility have been issued. Marie will get estimates on having our door locks re-keyed and ask Laura to keep a log of all keys issued as

well as tracking the issuing of the keypad combination to the office door. Keypad combination to the Community Center will be changed on a regular schedule.

8. As a reminder, there are procedures for nominating and electing at large Board members. We cannot nominate and elect someone on the spur of the moment in a meeting. They must first be vetted to make sure they meet requirements set forth in our bylaws.
9. Board member confidentiality/non-disclosure. This is a reminder that items discussed in the Board Meeting may be confidential and are not to be discussed outside of the Board. If Board members have concerns regarding Board actions, protocol or decisions they should be brought to the Executive Committee.

#### Business for Committee Discussion

1. Maintenance (Grounds & Plantings)
  - a. Homeowner asking committee to consider re-starting the "Clean-up" contract, due to accumulation of trash they have noticed.

- i. Previous Contract lists areas that should be under contract with RLC/other vendors. Possibly more a matter of enforcing/amending our current contracts than with hiring another vendor.
- ii. Contact contractors for costs to clean up common areas & Lotus Pond
- b. Works in Progress: bush-hogging at 5336 Revere and other areas, talk to PPC (Bill)
  - \*Liz has gone by and feels it's satisfactory, have we heard from Homeowners? SURVEY for post work?
2. Plantings (Landscaping): (Rob/Chris/Jeff)
  - a. Works in Progress: Plantings Google Survey
3. Playgrounds: In Progress
  - a. Basketball net replacement: Steven to buy, Liz will help install.
  - b. Tetherball check in.
  - c. Check in on driving spikes.
  - d. Cleaning (Marie): Barrs was contacted and we are awaiting an estimate for the cost to clean the playground equipment. Because of the delay, other contractors are now being contacted.
4. Drainage & Lake Maintenance: (Steven)
  - a. Dock Update: The pole was removed, and the kayak dock has become unmoored. Call into the vendor who installed has been made and price will be requested.
    - i. Update today: Installer was not able to commit to a date, but we think he will reinstall. Steven to check about accessibility comment.
  - b. The Rail to steps to the lake at Clermont Rd: Possibility of adding a rail to the bottom for stability? Staining? \*Might be a good project for church volunteers?
  - c. Bahai Center/Parkwood Common Area Drainage Project; Still trying to find a consultant willing to draw up a plan for the project required by the Durham Soil and Water Conservation. Steven is working with Jack Brown who has agreed to cost share, to follow up on state engineer. 3/2/26
  - d. DOT to fix ditch at Sedwick Park parking. Supposedly getting done.
5. Trail Maintenance (Steven)
  - a. Work in Progress: Arborist to evaluate the section of the ballfield to Lotus Pond trail that has multiple exposed roots and recommend how best to repair the trail without damaging the nearby trees. (Bill)

- a. Tree Policy Review: New Approval Protocol (proposed by Steven/Liz)

- Entrance Signage: Updated quote reflects a \$207.91 increase due to PVC cost changes. Board approval required for revised amount.
- Bridge Assessment: Responsibility transitioned to Parks and Lawns Committee.
- Trail Development Feasibility: Four potential future trail connections reviewed as conceptual possibilities.
- Traffic Calming: Positive meeting with Leslie Tracy; plans progressing for bike and pedestrian lanes on Sedwick Road with buffer improvements.
- Grant Writing Initiative: Janie and Chris to develop reusable grant templates to support community improvement efforts.
- Community Improvement Concepts: Group with Janie, Marie, Chris, and others will meet to brainstorm potential grant-funded projects.

## Notes

### Meeting Overview

- Meeting convened via Zoom at 7:00 PM.
- January meeting minutes were approved.
- Primary discussion areas included entrance signage cost update, trail feasibility review, traffic calming progress, and grant development strategy.

### Entrance Signage Update

- Original November 2024 quote of \$1,894.15 updated to \$2,102.06 due to increased PVC costs, reflecting a \$207.91 increase.
- Board approval required since the original amount had previously been approved.
  - Previous motion - 07/10/2025 Motion to approve the cost of materials and installation for 2 new entry signs, totaling \$1910.81 (including tax) to be paid from PPC Projects Code 05527-00. Payment should be made to Triangle Sign Company, 2525 Highway 70 East, Durham, 27703 per Estimate # 28037. Seconded. Motion passes unanimously.
  - New Motion for board approval - **Motion to amend board approval from 07/10/2025 to increase the cost of materials and installation by \$191.25 to pay Triangle Sign Company \$2102.06 from GL Code 05527-00 with \$1910.81 coming from 2025 budget & \$191.25 from 2026. Second. Motion passes unanimously.**

Motion with regard to Sedwick Road Entrance Sig-

nage for Parkwood:

1. To approve the cost of Landscape Features required by City: Not to Exceed \$800 – From PPC Projects GL-Code 05527  
**Motion to approve the cost of Landscape Features required by City: Not to Exceed \$800 – From PPC Projects GL-Code 05527. Seconded. 1 abstention. Motion passes.**
2. To approve Additional Costs for the Signs: Not to Exceed \$200
3. To approve Possible PPM Charge for Sign Vendor (if required): \$125  
 This Total Additional Approval: Not to Exceed \$1125 From GL-06027 PPC Engineering
4. Re-Approval of Motion to authorize the President or member of the Executive Committee to take necessary steps to procure a Cashier's check for \$1000 to be drawn from GL-06027 PPC Engineering to be delivered to the appropriate NC DOT authorities, upon receipt of all necessary permits from the City of Durham for the Sedwick Road signs. This check will be held in reserve to serve in lieu of the State's required performance and indemnity bond of \$1000 Cashiers Check for NC DOT (to be returned when Work Completed). This motion would expire if not exercised prior to December 31, 2026

**Motion to authorize the President or member of the Executive Committee to take necessary steps to procure a Cashier's check for \$1000 to be drawn from GL-06027 PPC Engineering to be delivered to the appropriate NC DOT authorities, upon receipt of all necessary permits from the City of Durham for the Sedwick Road signs. This motion would expire if not exercised prior to December 31, 2026. Second. Motion passes.**

- Seconded by Steven Berkowitz, and approved by Steven Berkowitz, Janie Long, Chris Classen, Mike Brooks, Rob Shoaf, and David Sokal. No response from Marie Dean or Wray Dean.
- UV-resistant coating option discussed; Pete to follow up with Mike regarding pricing and feasibility.
- Committee will request Board approval at the next Board meeting (anticipated within 2–3 weeks).

### Bridge Assessment Update

- Bridge assessment responsibility has been handed off to the Parks and Lawns Committee.

- No additional action assigned at this time.
- #### Trail Development Feasibility
- Pete shared a list of potential trail connections developed following trail walks by Pete, Steven, and Rob.
  - List is not ranked by feasibility and serves as a preliminary inventory of possibilities.
  - Width constraints noted in some potential connection areas.
    1. Southern end of Hidden Park to Emerald Circle Park
    2. Revere Road (behind Travis Circle) to the green space mown area
    3. Revere Road to Old Growth Trail between Braddock Circle and Milford Lane
    4. Long-range possibility from Timmons to McCormick at the tot lot
  - Further feasibility assessment required before prioritization or development.

#### Traffic Calming – Sedwick Road Resurfacing and Relining

- Productive meeting reported with Leslie Tracy.
- Plans include narrowing traffic lanes to 10 feet.
- Narrower lanes would allow for buffers between traffic and pedestrian/bike lanes.
- Proposed addition of pedestrian and bike lanes on both sides of Sedwick Road.
- Follow-up planned at the end of the month after new policy implementation by Durham City
- Leslie Tracy to receive follow-up communication to coordinate attendance at upcoming Spring flea market for information

#### Grant Writing Initiative

- Janie and Chris discussed prior grant writing experience and recommended development of reusable proposal templates.
- Committee agreed to create a flexible grant framework adaptable for multiple funding opportunities.
- Janie provided documentation outlining key components of grant proposals.
- General framing for Board discussion will use “enhancement and development of property.”
- Marie to join Janie and Chris in brainstorming and prioritization discussions.

#### Potential Community Improvement Projects

- Adult exercise equipment proposed for the grassy area between the office and firehouse.
- Shade structures suggested for Hidden Park.
- Shelter structures considered as long-term enhancements.
- Projects to be evaluated based on feasibility, cost, grant eligibility, timeline, and community impact.

- Small working group to compile and prioritize ideas before presenting specific proposals to the Board.

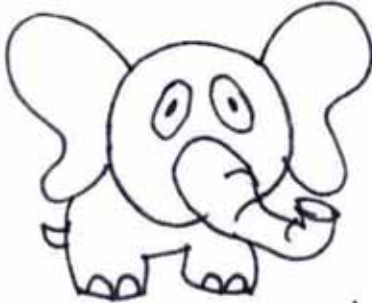

That's what I see.

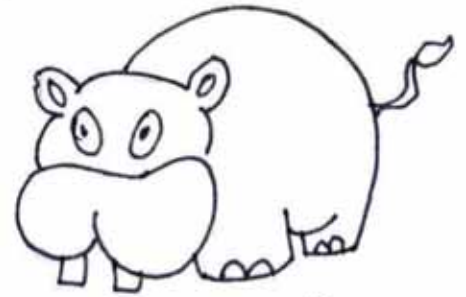


I see, I see. What do I see?
